

But one of the biggest concerns that about 50% of men face is losing their hair. Hair loss affects a man's social, personal, and professional life. These solutions not only include surgical procedures like hair transplantation, but also non-surgical options such as medications, laser therapy, and PRP (Protein Rich Plasma) Injections. The doctors will ask you a number of questions, analyze your medical and family history, as well as your lifestyle to unravel the real cause behind your hair loss. Once this is determined, the problem can be assessed effectively.

Medication is the best way to treat hair loss in the early stages, since it helps to prevent it.

Low Level Laser Therapy helps stimulate hair growth with easy treatments at home.

PRP Injections consist of the patient's own blood plasma concentrated with platelets that are injected into the scalp in the areas where hair loss is apparent. This is a natural and safe way to treat hair loss.

Hair Transplantation is the surgical way to restore hair loss. This is the best option when the above mentioned are not effective or when baldness is too advanced. This option is not exclusive to the scalp; it can also treat the beard, sideburns, and eyebrows. The two techniques are:

FUT (Follicular Unit Transplantation): Is the most commonly used hair transplant technique, where the surgeon removes a strip of tissue from the donor site and with the help of a specialized team dissects it into single follicular units. These hair follicles are then implanted through tiny incisions one hair at a time.

FUE (Follicular Unit Extraction): Is the technique in which hair follicles are extracted one by one in a scarless and non-invasive manner. The next step is the placement of each follicular unit individually. This is a very meticulous, precise, and lengthy technique.
